#### **BACKGROUND**

#### **About ICOMOS**

*ICOMOS* works for the conservation and protection of cultural heritage places, promoting the application of theory, methodology, and scientific techniques to the conservation of the architectural and archaeological heritage. ICOMOS has dedicated its Triennial Scientific Plan (2021-2024) to cultural heritage and climate action and will be an active partner in FUTURHIST. The ICOMOS International Scientific Committee Energy and Sustainability (ISCES), as one of the technical bodies of ICOMOS, researches and promotes the understanding, protection, conservation, and management of built cultural heritage through consideration of the requirements of energy, sustainability, and climate change.

## **About FUTURHIST**

The process of future proofing the historic European building stock faces the paradox of needing standardised approaches but having a heterogeneous stock with very specific needs. Historic and traditionally built buildings represent a quarter of the total building stock. Their renovation is a pressing issue in the clean transition since it has significant potential to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and improve users' comfort and wellbeing. On the other hand, historic buildings (HB) differ from modern construction in that their development over time in different cultural and socioeconomical contexts resulted in a much more diverse use of construction techniques and materials as well as important differences in their heritage values and attributes. That means that the renovation of each building must be considered carefully, and solutions must be designed individually, with corresponding higher costs and longer planning processes.

Approaches aiming at dealing with the entire built heritage as a homogeneous sample will thus face major challenges in its implementation. Instead, this project will "Think global, act local". FUTURHIST will rely on identification and characterisation of local uniform building typologies, as a lowest common denominator, to develop tailored intervention approaches that can be standardised and replicated with minor modifications. Furthermore, of any given building typology, only a few are usually protected by law. In providing solutions (efficient, cost-effective and durable) for the whole typology we are also preserving the "unprotected" built heritage, thereby ensuring the sustainability of our built environment and resilience of communities across Europe.

## SCOPE OF WORK OF ICOMOS WITHIN FUTURHIST

- 1) Design, distribute & analyse the survey on identification of barriers, analysis of legislation, and analysis of guidelines & tools
- 2) Identify, contact & interview frontrunner heritage authorities with policy tools to be shared in the consortium
- 3) Exploitation of the FUTURHIST Knowledge-Hub especially via the ICOMOS ISCES website; the ISCES website is to be revised in close consultation with the ISCES Board and enhanced with the knowledge gained from the project.
- 4) Communication and dissemination of project results by organising workshops, preparing training materials, and implementation of a European Summer Academy on the Refurbishment of Historic Buildings
- 5) Act as a point of reference for heritage preservation within the case study development.
