


Why this book is important

ICOMOS and the World Heritage and Sustainable Development Policy

- Challenges and renewal of intellectual framework
- UNESCO WH-SD Policy: principles/mechanisms to address deficits
- Steps to **operationalize** the policy: Workshops (Vilm 2016, Brussels 2018..)
- Needed: More research, mechanisms, actions, indicators
- Parallels between complexity of social and natural ecosystems
- Study and strengthen resilience, adaptation mechanisms
- More dynamic and precise management systems





Prospects for the Future...

- **Upstream process as promising, innovative platform**: Starting from Tentative Lists, reflect on governance and management, links to SDGs, mutual benefits across wider social, geographical contexts
- Ambition of World Heritage: nodes of excellence for heritage in general
