## **US/ICOMOS: 2009 International Exchange Program – seeking Intern applicants and host organizations in the US and abroad**

### **Seeking Intern Applicants**

US/ICOMOS internships are geared toward individuals who are in their last year of a relevant graduate program or have been working for 1-3 years in a professional capacity. Successful applicants are those who demonstrate an interest in pursuing preservation work in an international capacity, NOT simply those who need an internship to fulfill a program requirement. The program is very competitive in that only 1 in 5 applicants are awarded internships in any given

year. Applications are due January 30, 2009. Please read all information carefully before preparing and submitting an application. Interns must apply to the program as a whole, and not for a specific internship location. Please review the reports on the past three seasons to view the types of internships usually sponsored under this program.

### **Seeking Host Organizations in the US and Overseas**

Through grants from private foundations, US/ICOMOS expects to offer between 10 and 15 internships overseas in 2009 for U.S. preservationists who are at the early stages of their careers. Through contributions from US host organizations, we also expect to offer between 10 and 15 internships in the United States for non-U.S. citizens.

US/ICOMOS is seeking additional host organizations overseas for the 2009 International Exchange Program. We raise a limited amount of funds through grants from foundations and donations from private individuals to send about 10 to 12 young American preservationists overseas to work with a variety of preservation organizations in other countries. In order to provide more opportunities, host organizations are needed that can provide housing for the intern and a full or partial stipend for the intern (for food and basic living costs).

US/ICOMOS is also seeking additional host organizations for the 2009 International Exchange Program. U.S. host organizations contribute funds to US/ICOMOS to cover recruitment and processing of intern applications, orientation in Washington for the interns, and distribution of stipends over the course of the internships. US/ICOMOS supplements the host contributions with grants and donations from private individuals. Private, commercial firms are eligible for serving as host organizations.

## **US/ICOMOS: Registration now open for the 12<sup>th</sup> US/ICOMOS International Symposium “Preservation in Peril – Disaster Planning, Rapid Response, and Sustainable Recovery in the 21st Century”**

**New Orleans, 11-15 March 2009**

The theme of the symposium derives directly from recommendations generated by the 2006 Preserve America Summit (also held in New Orleans) and the 2008 11th US/ICOMOS Symposium – US Participation in the Global Heritage Community – which was held in Washington. The 12th US/ICOMOS Symposium seeks to discuss and develop the outlines of a national model for disaster preparedness, recovery, and sustainable response regarding heritage sites that also can be

incorporated when providing US disaster relief assistance overseas. New Orleans was selected as the location for the conference because of its obvious relevance to the symposium topic and the desire for US/ICOMOS to help contribute to the city's recovery efforts by bringing people (and their dollars) to New Orleans to learn from its experience.

The symposium will examine the myriad of challenges surrounding the documentation and conservation of twentieth century sites, including individual buildings, townscapes and communities. Emphasis will be focused on the architectural legacy of Modernism, in all its international guises, and on public sites. These discussions on Modern sites will be complemented by other presentations on the management of townscapes in contexts that are much older (for instance Afghanistan and Indonesia), but that face fundamental challenges presented by twentieth century effects of war and globalization.

The symposium public lectures, panels and plenary presentations will chart the processes of conservation through the themes of “Documentation”, “Heritage Policy and Implementation” and “Conservation and Re-Use”. Individual invited speakers span a wide breadth of international experience from academic historians and conservation architects, to heritage practitioners and policy-makers. A number of speakers are active members of Docomomo International and specialist committees.

The symposium is being hosted by the Faculty of Architecture Building and Planning, and the School of Historical Studies at the University of Melbourne. The event is being generously sponsored and supported by: Docomomo International; the Australian Research Council, the University of Melbourne, the Australian Academy of Humanities; Docomomo Australia, the Heritage Council of Victoria, and the Ian Potter Foundation. The symposium is convened by Dr Hannah Lewi with Prof Philip Goad, Prof Kate Darian-Smith, Dr David Nichols and Assoc Prof Julie Willis.

## **OWHC: Call for Candidacies for the Jean-Paul L'Allier Heritage Prize**

### **Description**

This prize is awarded every second year by the Organization of World Heritage Cities to a city that is a member of the OWHC and that has distinguished itself by its achievements in the conservation, enhancement or management of property inscribed on the World Heritage List, and located on its territory.

### **Eligibility**

A city that is a member in good standing of the Organization of World Heritage Cities and that has been so for the three preceding years may submit its candidacy to be awarded the Jean-Paul L'Allier Heritage Prize.

### **Timetable of the program**

April 30, 2009     Deadline for the reception of the candidacies  
May to July 2009     Study by the jury of the candidacies received  
August 2009         Announcement of the winning city  
September 2009     Award of the Jean-Paul L'Allier Prize for Heritage in Quito

### **Achievements evaluated**

The purpose of the prize is to recognize and to reward an achievement or a number of achievements of a city that is a member of the OWHC, in terms of conservation, enhancement or management of property inscribed on the World Heritage List, and that is located on the territory of the candidate city.

The achievements must have been implemented directly by the candidate city or by a person or a body that is supported, directed or influenced by the candidate city. If the achievement was not implemented directly by the candidate city, the latter's participation in the implementation must have been significant.

Applications for the Advanced Masters in Structural Analysis of Monuments and Historical Constructions, approved and financially sponsored by the European Commission within the framework of the Erasmus Mundus Programme, have just opened.

## Sixteenth International Seminar on Urban Form

### Guangzhou, China, 4 - 7 September 2009

The Sixteenth International Seminar on Urban Form (ISUF 2009), co-hosted by South China University of Technology and Guangzhou Urban Planning Bureau, will take place in Guangzhou, China from Friday 4 September to Monday 7 September 2009.
